The LMC strategy covers the period from 2009-2013 and encompasses the four areas: Research, Education, Innovation and Public Sector Consultancy.

Within research, the focus will be on the following 7 areas: 1) Consumer-Oriented Added Value in the Food Chain, 2) Food Safety in a Global Perspective, 3) Personalised Nutrition and Health, 4) Sustainable and Ethical Food Production, 5) Modern Production Technology, 6) Biocatalysis and Synthetic Biology and 7) Molecular Functionality.



The strategic focus areas will each include a LMC network which will enhance the research initiatives nationally as well as internationally – see above.

LMC Strategic Pool

LMCs Strategic Pool is targeted to support the selected research areas outlined in the LMC strategy. All researchers within LMC have the possibility to get their share of the money.

The money can be used for networking activities, initiation of joint research projects and other collaborative initiatives e.g. within education.
